In our main supermarkets in Queensland fairtrade products are available. Buying Fairtrade is buying smarter. When you purchase products with the Fairtrade Mark, you're helping eradicate global poverty and inequality around the world – straight from you trolley. The international Fairtrade system exists to end poverty through trade and works with almost 2million farmers and workers in developing countries worldwide. It owns the Fairtrade Mark – the most trusted ethical label in the world – appearing on over 30,000 products globally.

Ideas for April:

- In Queensland, we have 3 leading supermarkets Aldi, Coles, Woolworths. All provide information on their websites about the steps they have taken to achieve sustainability. It is well worth looking at and familiarising yourself with their best practices.
- Aldi work under the heading of Sustainability in areas they call Good Planet, Good Community, Good Health, and Good business.
- <u>Coles</u> also use Sustainability to promote their efforts in Together to zero and Better together.
- <u>Woolworths</u> work from the lead of A better tomorrow to showcase their emphasis in Growing greener, Making healthy easier, Caring for all Australians, and Celebrating Australian Fresh.
- You can find their certified fairtrade products online and purchase online or instore coffee tea, cocoa, chocolate, and ice cream.

 We all support these businesses in some form and you can see how they are addressing sustainability practices around packaging, energy use, recycling, responsible sourcing of products.

Let's play our part by knowing where our groceries come from, buying local, buying responsibly and supporting business that are trying to address real global issues.
