

As a Parish we are committed to playing our part to follow the call from Pope Francis to care for creation and our common home with our own Parish Action Plan. This month our focus is on the Laudato Si Goal 4 - *Adoption of Sustainable lifestyles* - as we continue with practical suggestions that will help bring to action some simple steps we can all take.

With the return of Parish morning teas on a regular basis, we try to avoid single use items and plastics by using mugs and cups that can be washed and re-used. We will soon move to re-usable plastic cups for cold water, too. Our throw away waste is kept to a bare minimum with all plastic separated for recycling. You may have noticed the generous sharing recently by some Parishioners of their excess home grown produce. Have you made a conscious decision to go meat-free once or more a week? Why not enjoy a vegetable curry or vegetable pasta bake - minus the meat?

The Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles is grounded in the idea of sufficiency and promoting sobriety in the use of resources and energy. Actions could include reducing waste and recycling, adopting sustainable dietary habits (opting for a more plant-based diet and reducing meat consumption), greater use of public transport, active mobility (walking, cycling), and avoiding single use items (e.g. plastic, etc.).
