The search includes reaching out to the marginalised people

- in our society,
- in our families,
- in our churches,
- in our neighbourhoods,
- in the world.

We are invited, in the light of Jesus,

- to search out the goodness of others,
- to listen to and stand with the disadvantaged,
- to advocate with them.
- to shares the struggle and the joy.

FISHING NET

The Gospel continues:

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and caught fish of every kind; when it was full, they drew it ashore, sat down, and put the good into baskets but threw out the bad.'





We are called

- to affirm the goodness lived every day across our nation and world.
- to affirm all the goodness lived in ministries serving others.

In a genuine Christian way, we care called to challenge the badness.

We are called to challenge the temptations to cover-up, ignore, abuse, discriminate and belittle.

WEST PAPUA

We have received a special request to pray for the people of West Papua.

The people of West Papua have been waiting

for a true and fair referendum for many decades now.

They have been abused and persecuted.

This has been well documented by several agencies,

including the United Nations, Amnesty International

and our Catholic Justice & Peace Commission of the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

Three years ago, a document signed by well over one and half million West Papuans was smuggled out of West Papua, verified and presented to the United Nations.

Several days ago, 57 priests in West Papua supported the call for a genuine referendum for the people of West Papua. https://www.ucanews.com/.../papuan-priests-call-for-ind.../88883 (West Papua is currently divided into Papua and West Papua provinces).

The people of West Papua are still searching for justice and peace.

The people of West Papua are still waiting for their human rights and dignity to be respected.

Let us pause and pray for the people of West Papua.

Let us pause and pray for the 157 priests and all their faith leaders and communities.

We pray that our lives are a lifelong listening to Jesus.

We pray for continual openness in our church

to the challenges, joys, struggles, hope and resolute action that are our mission.
