### A FOCUS ON PROPHETS

We begin by remembering a quote from the parish homily last week.

#### SAINT EDITH STEIN 1891-1942

"a Jewish woman, Edith Stein, who was one of millions of Jewish people killed by the Nazis in the horrendous death camps.

*Edith was a brilliant academic and philosopher who did her doctoral thesis on Empathy. She dedicated her life to the search for truth.* 

When she became a Carmelite Sister, she chose the name Sr Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Her courage inspired others, to love and learn, and to seek justice.

God graced her to forgive and to share the gift of peace with others."

With this weekend's Gospel focus on prophets, we remember that St Edith Stein was a prophet as well as a saint.

In 1933 she wrote to Pope Pius X1 about Hitler's treatment of Jewish people. It was not until 2003 that the letter was released so that we could all read it. Let us read together part of her plea to the Church.

"As a child of the Jewish people who, by the grace of God, for the past eleven years has also been a child of the Catholic Church, I dare to speak to the Father of Christianity about that which oppresses millions of Germans.

For weeks we have seen deeds perpetrated in Germany which mock any sense of justice and humanity, not to mention love of neighbor.

For years the leaders of National Socialism have been preaching hatred of the Jews. Now that they have seized the power of government and armed their followers, among them proven criminal elements, this seed of hatred has germinated.

... But through boycott measures--by robbing people of their livelihood, civic honor and fatherland—

it drives many to desperation; within the last week, through private reports I was informed of five cases of suicide as a consequence of these hostilities. I am convinced that this is a general condition which will claim many more victims ... But the responsibility must fall, after all, on those who brought them to this point and it also falls on those who keep silent in the face of such happenings. Everything that happened and continues to happen on a daily basis originates with a

government that calls itself "Christian."

For weeks not only Jews but also thousands of faithful Catholics in Germany, and, I believe, all over the world, have been waiting and hoping for the Church of Christ to raise its voice to put a stop to this abuse of Christ's name.

Is not this idolization of race and governmental power which is being pounded into the public consciousness by the radio open heresy?

Isn't the effort to destroy Jewish blood an abuse of the holiest humanity of our Savior, of the most blessed Virgin and the apostles? ..."

She signed the letter

'Dr. Edith Stein, Instructor at the German Institute for Scientific Pedagogy, Münster in Westphalia, Collegium Marianum.'

And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. And he was amazed at their unbelief.' "

God continues to call prophets to speak His words.
